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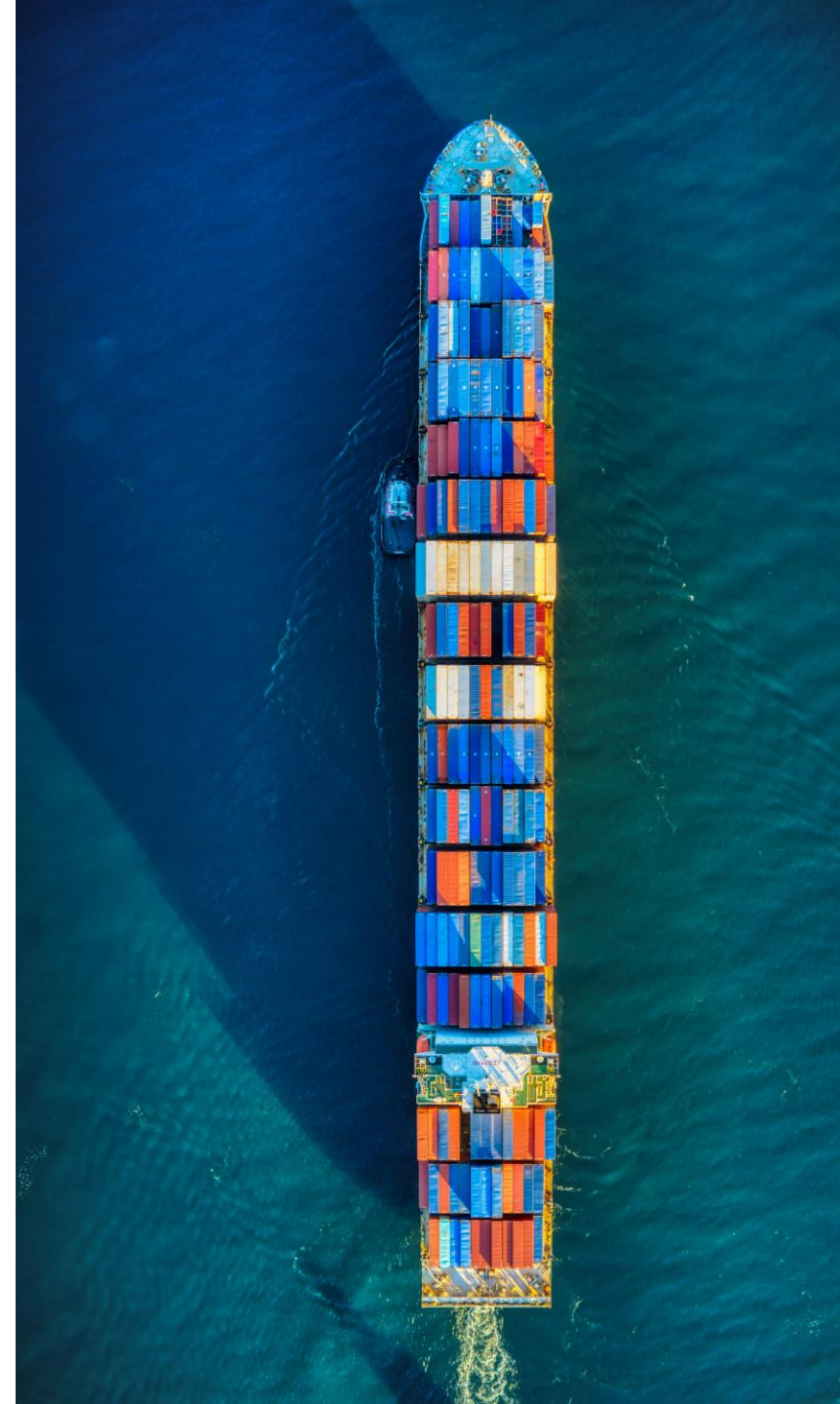

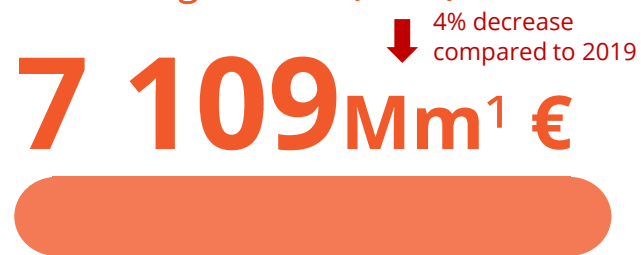

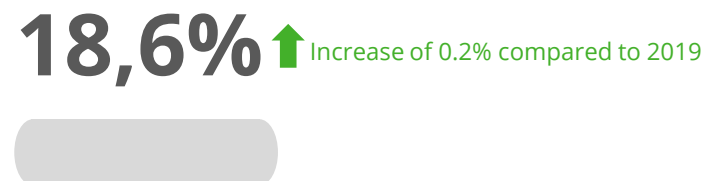

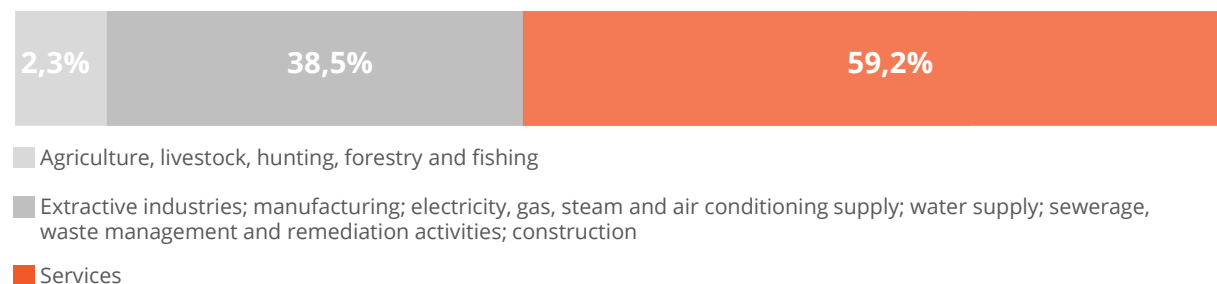

#3 Location and logistical infrastructure

The region's vast and solid network of transport and communication technology infrastructure is a determining factor for its success as a commercial location, both nationally and internationally

Geostrategic location

One of the biggest competitive advantages of the Aveiro Region, in the national context, is its privileged geostrategic location.

This advantage is consolidated essentially by the vast presence of transport infrastructures, which enable different types of mobility (rail, sea, air, road, pedestrian and cycling) that allow rapid inter-regional and international connections.

This transport infrastructure network strongly contributes to affirming the region as a critical territory for commercial flows at a national level and as a promoter of socio-economic dynamics with Europe and the rest of the world.

Rail, road, sea and air transport infrastructures



Railway

The region has excellent rail connections that enable the transport of passengers and cargo throughout the country, especially the **Alfa Pendular, Intercity, and Regional** services, provided by CP - Comboios de Portugal.



Maritime

With an annual traffic of about 5.5 million tons¹, the **Port of Aveiro** is the largest conventional general cargo infrastructure, playing a key role in supporting the economic activity and the export capacity of many Portuguese industries. Also noteworthy is the quick access to the **Port of Leixões**, located 1 hour away from the center of Aveiro



Roadway

There are several road infrastructures serving Aveiro, enabling connections to the north, south and with the rest of Iberia. **The main distribution routes are: A1, A17 and A25.**



Aerial

The region has quick access (45 minutes) to the **Francisco Sá Carneiro International Airport (OPO)** and the **São Jacinto Municipal Aerodrome**, which is used for military but also commercial purposes.



Intermodal Platform

The Port of Aveiro has a **Zone of Industrial and Logistics Activities (ZALI)** with a waterfront of 1000 meters of quay. The ZALI is a unique port logistics platform in Portugal, as it offers **competitive maritime and road-rail connections to international markets**, including the possibility for economic operators to use a private harbor.

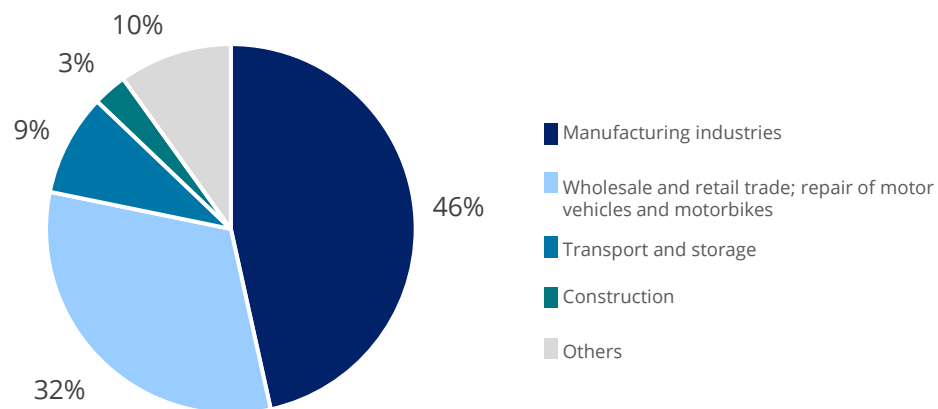

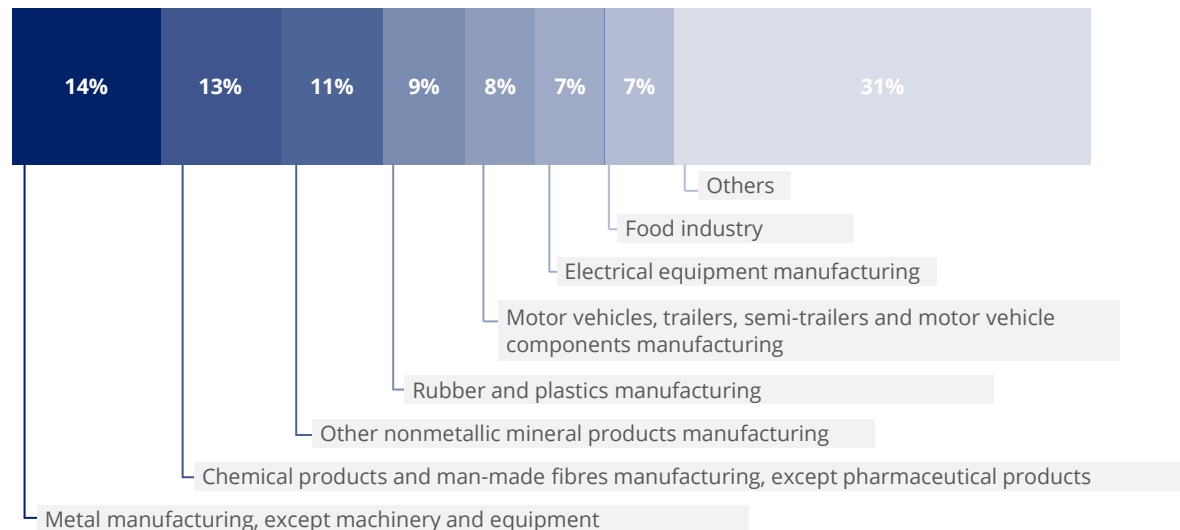

Aveiro Tech City is an initiative that brings people, business, research institutes and the latest tech developments together to redefine how to live, and work within a city permeated by a **new digital and interconnected reality**.



This initiative was recognized by Harvard University, which distinguished the Portuguese city with the Innovation in Community Engagement Award 2020.

Aveiro STEAM City



This project is based on four axes of action: Education, Training, Technology and Applications and Challenges, which include a wide range of activities. From the installation of **Techlabs** in schools to the creation of a **responsive employment observatory** and the development of an urban data platform as well as a living lab with fiber infrastructure, sensors and **5G connectivity** in the city.

The project also involves the promotion of code **Bootcamps**, challenges aimed at startups, scaleups, and R&D centers, as well as artistic residencies for digital art.

The fiscal framework provides several tax benefit regimes for investment to support growth, R&D and job creation, as well as other advantages for companies



Tax Regime for Investment Support (RAFI)

Reduction of collection, up to 50% of the total cumulative value in:

- › Investments up to 5M€, 25% deduction;
- › Investments over 5M€, 10% deduction;
- › *Startups, the deduction is made up to 100% of the IRC collection in the first 3 years;*
- › Expenses can be deducted up to 5 years if there is insufficient collection.



Support Regime for Productive Investment

- › Tax benefits regime, in a contractual regime, with a validity period of up to 10 years counted from the conclusion of the investment project, to investment projects whose relevant applications are of an amount equal or superior to 3.000.000€.
- › Credit between 10% and 25% of the income tax collection.



VAT - Deductions

- › Goods and services acquired for actual use in the taxable activity;
- › Goods for export or concerning international transport;
- › Goods and services relating to exempt financial transactions when the purchaser is established outside the European Union;
- › Other goods and services related to exempt transactions;
- › Special exemption regimes.

BILATERAL AGREEMENTS

Over the past decades, Portugal has established **important agreements on a global level to avoid double taxation**, allowing income obtained in Portugal by a foreign citizen from a country with which Portugal has a Double Taxation Treaty (DTC) to **benefit from lower withholding rates**. In all, **79 countries** are covered by these conventions.

OTHER INTERNATIONAL AGREEMENTS

There are also several **reciprocal investment promotion and protection agreements**, which act as bilateral instruments with binding measures.

Their main purpose is to **create more favorable conditions for investments** by investors of one of the signatory states in the territory of the other, ensuring, on a reciprocal basis, the most favorable **treatment of investors and the guarantee of full protection and security for investments already made**.

These agreements focus on **4 major areas**: admission of investments, treatment of investments, expropriation and investment losses, and dispute resolution. Portugal has agreements in place with more than **50 countries**.

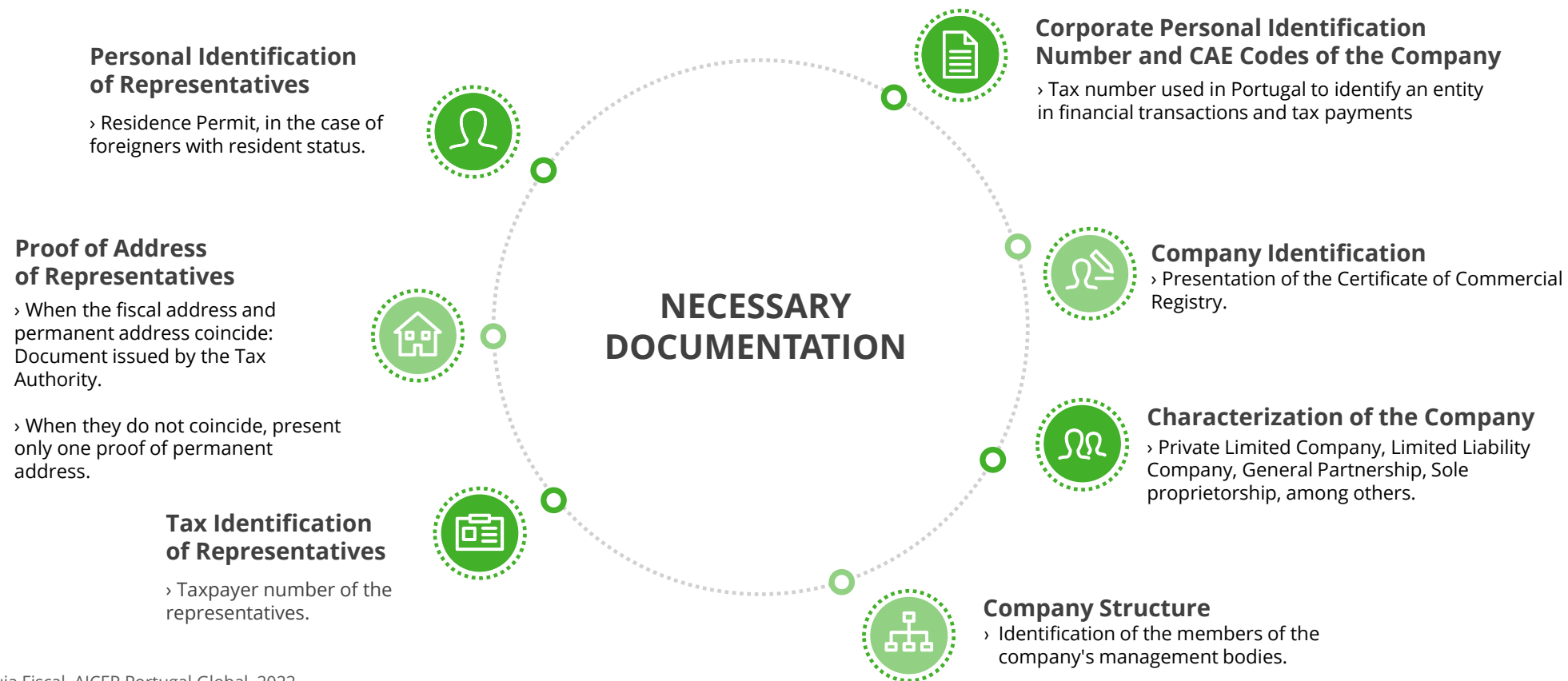

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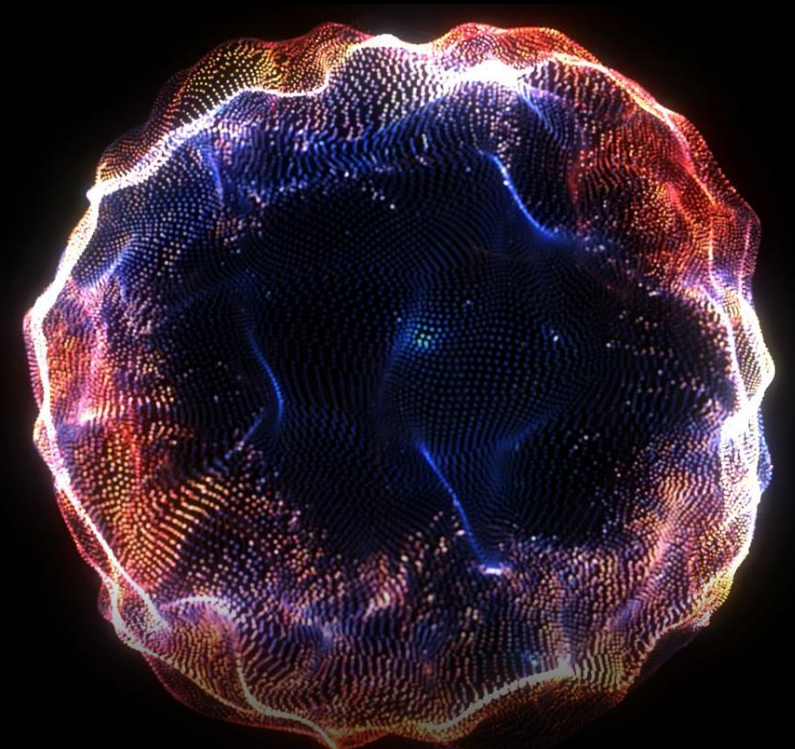
